









Maine's economic output






Maine's real economic output is up 11% since beginning of 2019 – and up 16% from pandemic low in mid-2020


Indexed Manufacturing and Total GDP Growth (2019 Q1 = 100)








Total Nonfarm Employment Maine (Seasonally Adjusted)



Maine Invests in Workforce

NEW Maine Workforce Development Compact:Grants for employers up to \$1,200 per employee

College graduates who live and work in Maine may be eligible for up to \$2,500/year through the **Student Loan Repayment Program**, up to \$25,000 lifetime.

Apprenticeship Support. \$500-\$2,500 reimbursement per worker accepted to apprenticeship program.

On The Job Training. Reimbursement of up to 50% of wages per worker for up to 480 hours in OTJ training support.

Dirigo Business Incentives

BENEFIT

investment tax
credit
*Limited to 5% in
Cumberland,

Sagadahoc, and York

\$2,000 tax credit per worker trained

ELIGIBILITY

- For-profit businesses in Maine
- Sector limited, including manufacturing, agriculture, fishing, logging/forestry, freight, software, certain professional services like scientific research—DECD approves eligibility
- Community college, university, DOL trainings, approved private trainings

RESTRICTIONS

- Credit capped at \$2,000,000 per business per year, can take up to five years. Up to \$500,000 of the credit would be refundable per year
- Credit not allowed following/during major workforce reductions
- Companies with ongoing PTDZ, ETIF, or certain special tax credit certification would not receive this credit at the same time
